

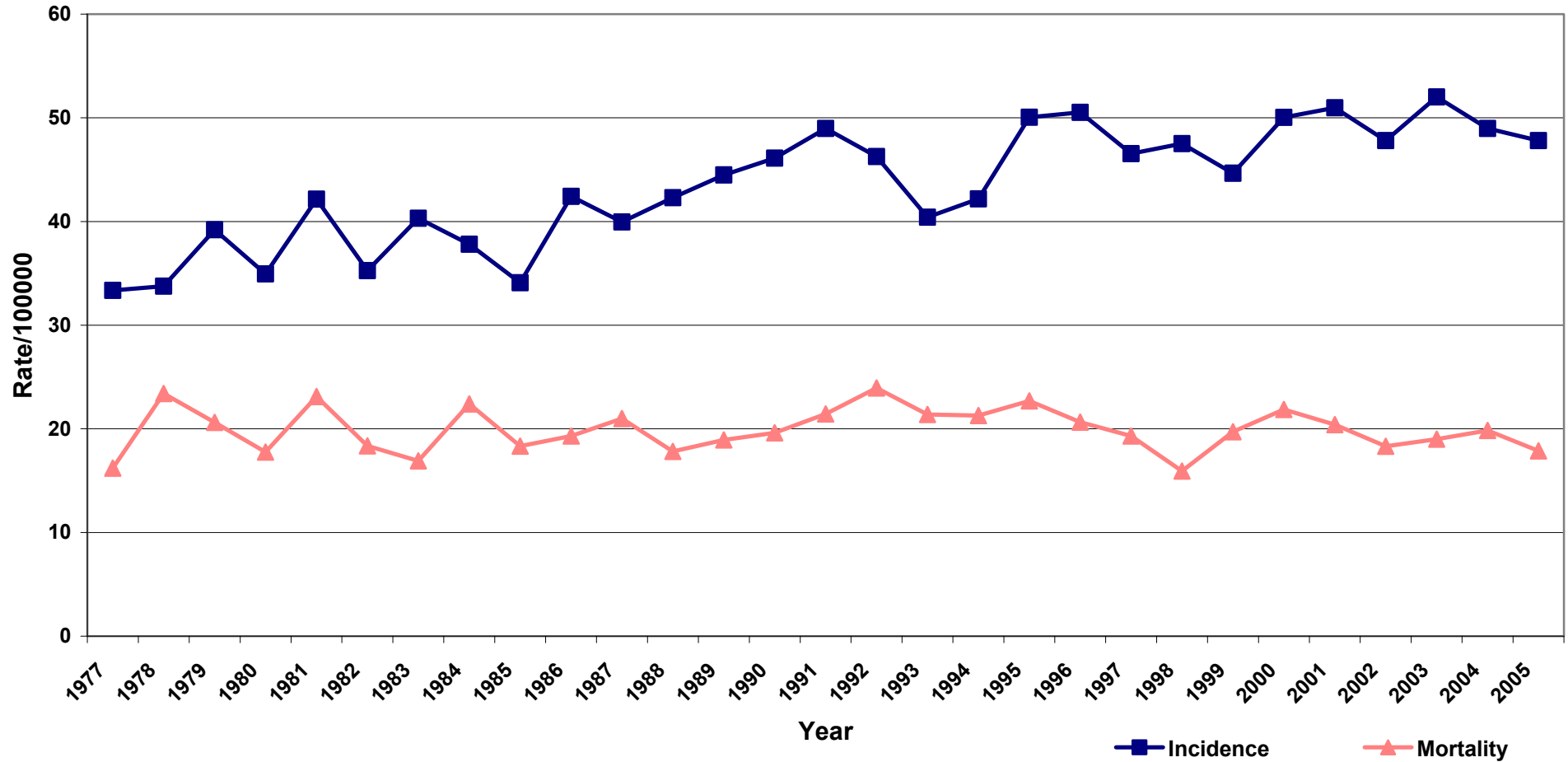
Colon Cancer

Male colon cancer incidence and mortality rates have been steady over the period 1995-2005. For females the incidence rate has been steady, but the mortality rate has decreased by 10%. Incidence rates for this cancer may begin to rise in future as the national colorectal screening program begins to have an impact.

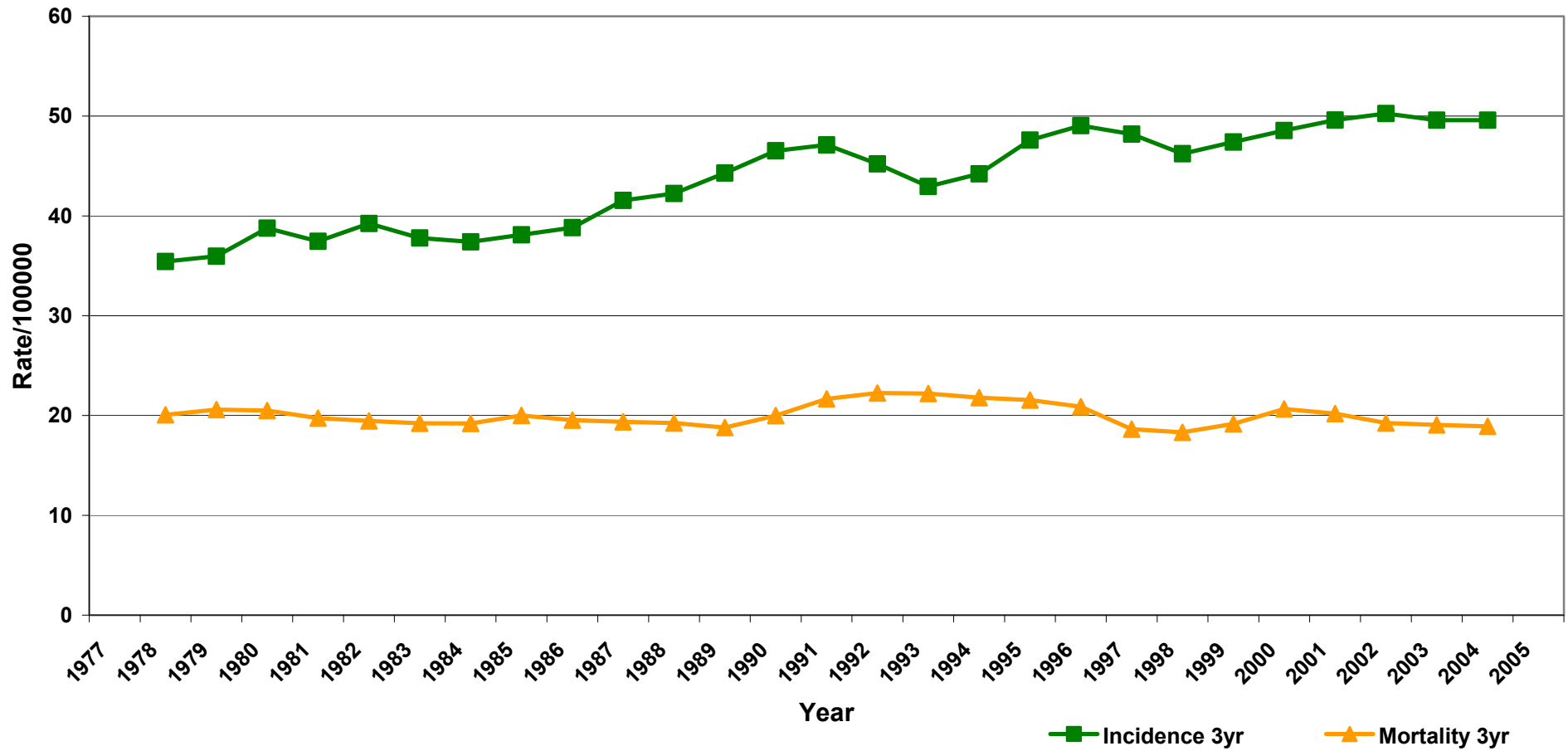

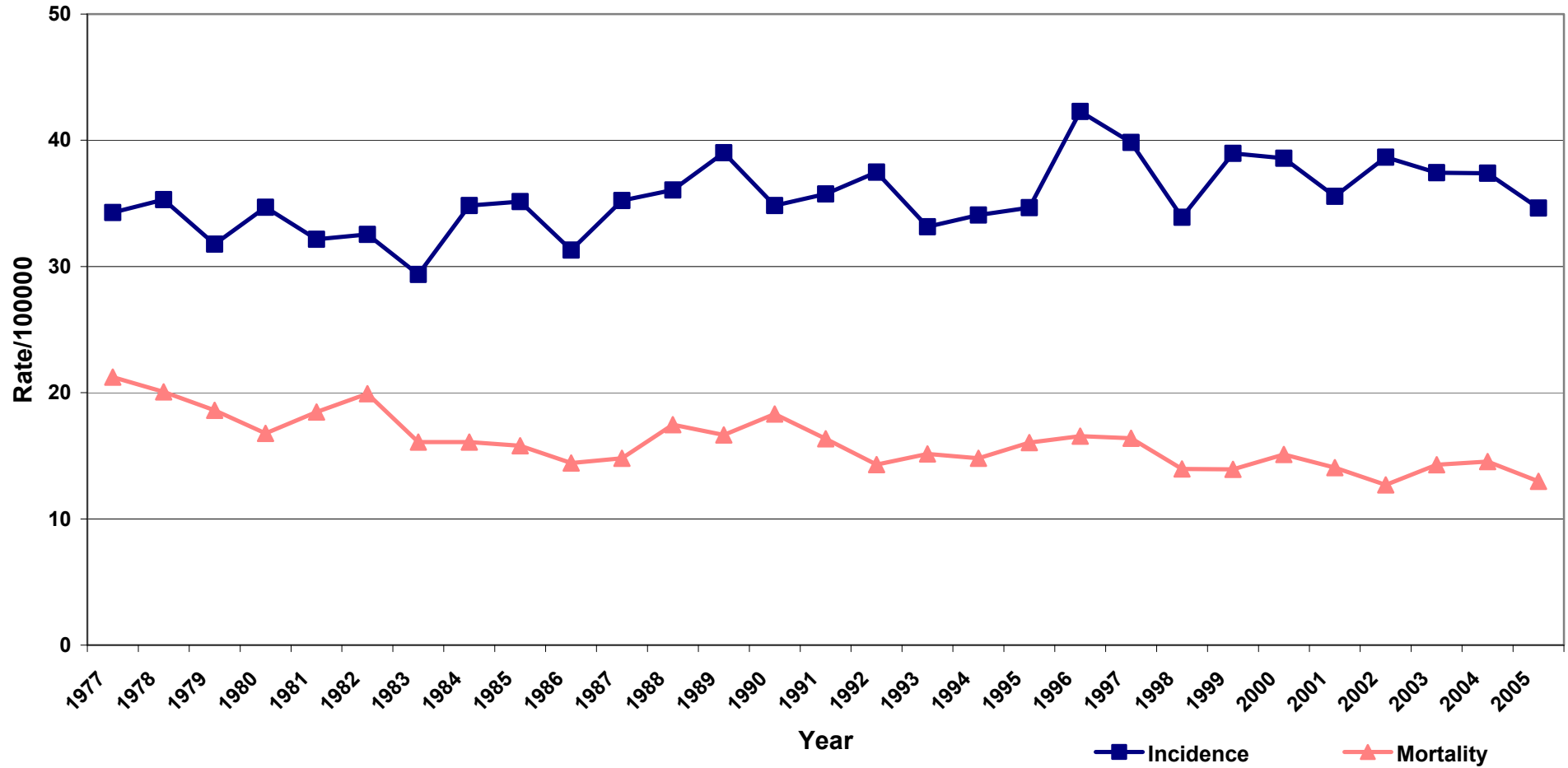

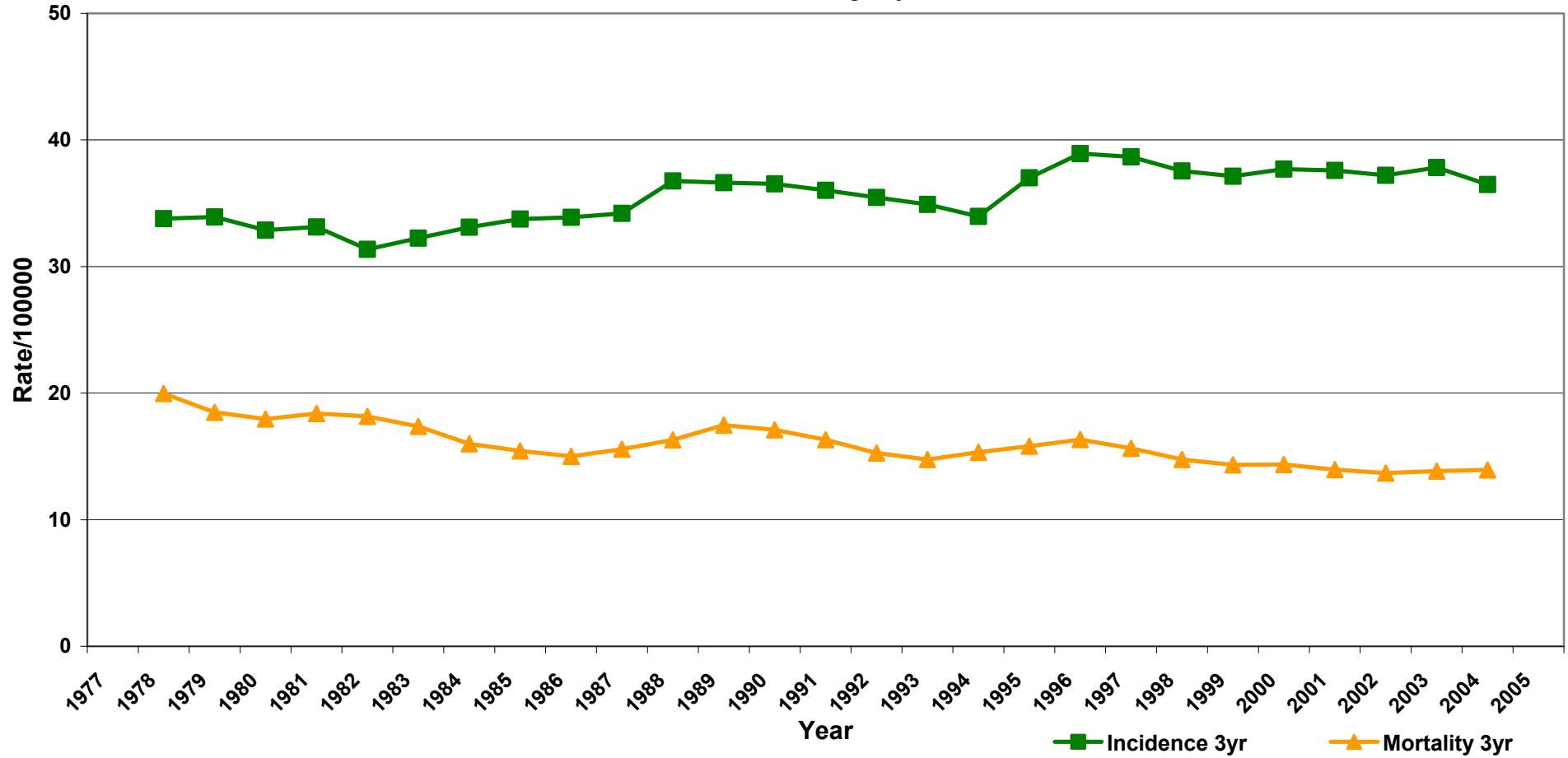
