- Routine notification to the Communicable Disease Control Branch as soon as practicable and, in any event, within 3 days of suspecting or confirming a diagnosis of a notifiable disease: Telephone (08) 8226 7177 or Facsimile (08) 8226 7187.

- Routine notification to Sexually Transmitted Disease (STD) Services: the appropriate form will be forwarded automatically to the doctor upon a positive laboratory result, or telephone (08) 8222 2526 to notify the infection.
- Routine notification to SA Tuberculosis Service on telephone (08) 8222 5483 or complete the notification form and send via facsimile to Fax (08) 8222 5398 within 3 days of suspicion or confirmation of diagnosis.
